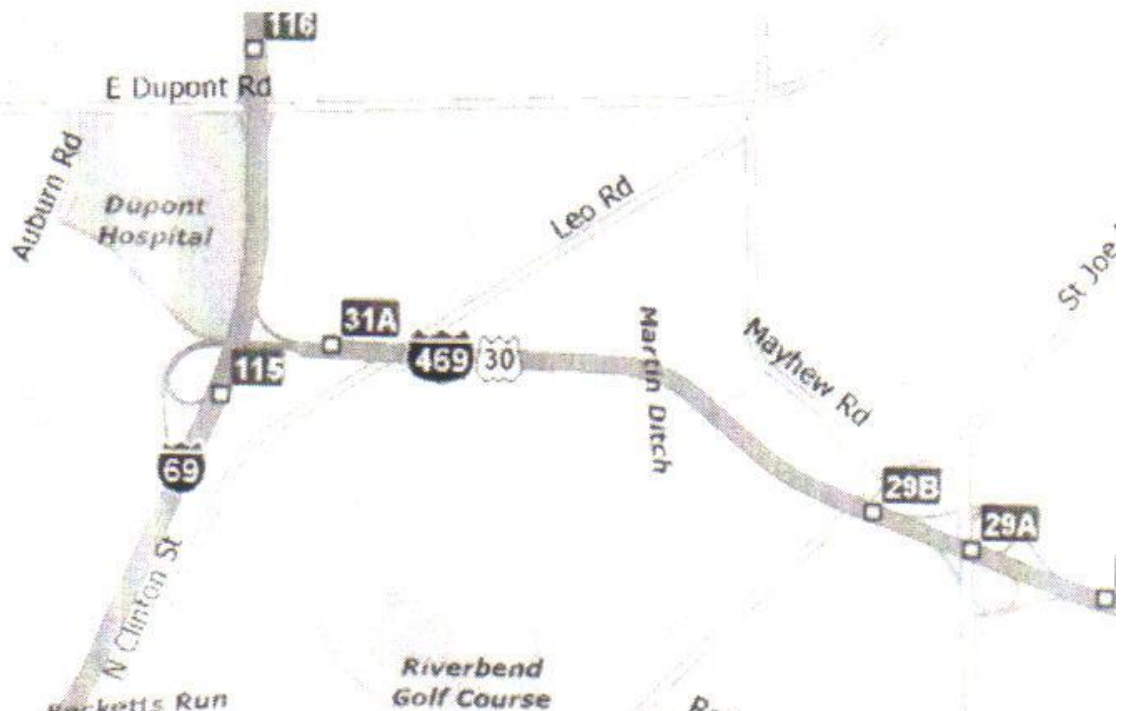

DIRECTIONS TO AMERICAN LEGION HALL: Take I-69 to Fort Wayne E 112 (coming south from Michigan) or Exit 112-A (going north from Indianapolis). You will see the Marriott Hotel on right if are staying overnight and also a Marathon service station over to the far left corner. If heading to the American Legion direct, after you come off exit, get IMMEDIATELY over to the two left turn lanes. Turn left at the two left turn signals; make sure you stay in the left lane. This is Washington Center Road that eventually turns into St. Joe Center Road. You will then go through a total of four traffic lights after turning left. At the fifth traffic light, you will turn left from St. Joe Center Road on to St. Joe Road. At this intersection on the left side, Riviera Plaza shopping is on the left and McDonald's, Cosmo's and Taco Bell/Pizza Hut is on the right. After turning left, make sure you are in the right lane of these two lanes. The American Legion is about two miles down on the right hand side of the road. (Shoaff Park is across the street from the American Legion to use as a landmark to locate the Legion.) Map below should assist in locating the Legion off I-69, Exit 112.

Reservations and Room rates: The nightly room rate is \$87.00 + 12% tax. Hotel reservations must be made by September 26th, 2008, please make your reservations now. Please mention LPA or use the link above to get the LPA block room rate.

Fee Waiver: For those attending their first regional conference or those that might find it difficult to afford the cost of a regional please contact April Brazier for a waiver of the registration fee. The fee waiver only applies to LPA registration costs. Hotel and meal costs are the responsibility of the attendee.

Hotel Information: Located in the historic downtown area of Springfield, Illinois, the newly remodeled Hilton Springfield hotel offers its guests three outstanding food and beverage options. This includes The Highland Room, Bennigan's Grill & Tavern and the only Starbucks® in Downtown Springfield. Guests will also enjoy the Fitness by Precor® Workout Room or relax the heated indoor pool. Each room is furnished with a king or queen bed, an oversized work desk, ergonomic leather desk chair, Mp3 clock radio, 32" flat screen HDTV with expanded cable channels, video games, safe, digital thermostat, Cuisinart coffee maker, and high-speed Internet access.

Airport/Shuttle Service: The closest airport to the Hilton is the Abraham Lincoln Capitol Airport (SPI). The Hilton does provide a complimentary shuttle service to and from the airport and train station however this shuttle is NOT handicapped accessible. If you are able to climb the stairs there is room to stow your scooter/wheelchair. Please contact the hotel directly to arrange necessary transportation.

Parking: The Hilton Springfield offers parking in the ramp for \$7 a day with in and out privileges, those parking passes can be purchased at the front desk. Another option is to pay \$.50 an hour or \$5.50 for a 24-hour time period if you choose to pay this way do so at the parking ramp itself. The hotel is unable to offer us a parking discount because the ramp is owned by the city of Springfield.

Outside the Hotel: The Hilton Springfield hotel is the closest hotel to most of the Abraham Lincoln historic sites. The Abraham Lincoln Presidential Museum and Library and Lincoln's Home Site are both two blocks away. The Old State Capitol, the Frank Lloyd Wright designed Dana-Thomas House, Governor's Mansion and Lincoln's Tomb, as well as many other sites are less than five minutes away. The Illinois State Fairgrounds, Knight's Action Water Park, Route 66, and White Oaks Mall are all easily accessible from our front door.

DISTRICT 6 REGIONAL INFO AND RULES

1. A lower registration fee for students and senior citizens.
 - Student Registration is \$10 a person. A copy of the valid student ID must be enclosed with the members registration form and/or present onsite.
 - Senior citizens are \$10 a person or \$20 a couple – a senior citizen is 65 and older.
2. Onsite Registration will be \$5 on site per category as well as \$5 more per event IF that event can be purchased onsite. For example if banquet is \$20 a meal it will be \$25 onsite.
3. Registration will only be available during set times. If you cannot make it to registration during these times you MUST make prior arrangements.
4. Registration will not be available during the general assembly meeting. Once the meeting is over ½ of the regional is over therefore registration is closed. Again if you do NOT plan on getting there until the afternoon arrangements can be made and you will be able to register sometime Saturday afternoon if you contact April.
5. Bracelets are required to get into the dance on Saturday night. If you do NOT register for the regional you will not be permitted into the dance. To obtain entrance into the dance only is a \$10 cover charge. Chapter presidents will be monitoring the door and bracelets will be checked.

What does Regional Registration Pay For?

Many times I get the question “Why do I have to pay to come to a regional?” Listed below are what your regional registration goes to pay.

- DJ
- Hotel Fees
- Banquet decorations
- Audio/Visual fees if we use AV
- Name tags or badges
- Wrist bracelets
- Paper & printing costs for tickets, schedules, agendas, registration envelopes, etc
- Hospitality room food
- Kids room supplies and snacks
- Supplement Attic when necessary
- Guest expenses

Regional Reminders- These have been long standing regional guidelines and serve as a reminder.

2. If you use a different hotel room discount such as AAA the room does not count towards the LPA room block. LPA is fined if we do NOT make our room block. Please let me know if you are making a reservation outside the room block because of pricing and I will work with the hotel.
3. The Kids Room is designed to provide a place for children to interact with their peers while parents participate in LPA related meetings. Parents are expected to stay at the hotel and pick up their children in the Kids Room at the designated time. We want to appreciate volunteers that assist us with the Kids Room so please be considerate of their time.

These checks are NOT deposited until after the regional, in case there's a problem with your registration. For onsite registrations cash in the amount will be accepted. In the event that your check is returned for insufficient funds, a returned check fee of \$15 is applied. You cannot attend another regional until payment of the original amount and the \$15 fee are received.
