The Passing of JoAnn Bayer – Submitted by Allison Lourash

JoAnn Bayer passed away in December at the age of 60. She was a longtime member of LPA even though she was not able to attend events outside of Springfield, IL in the past years because of transportation and health. I knew JoAnn more from her history as a well known disability rights advocate in Illinois than LPA. I frequently would see her at the annual Coalition of Citizens with Disabilities annual conference and she always made a point to ask me about what was going on in LPA. JoAnn Bayer, age 60, of Edwardsville, formerly of Springfield, died at 10:45 a.m., on Tuesday, Dec. 30, 2008, at Edwardsville Nursing and Rehabilitation. She was born on June 4, 1948, in Highland, the daughter of the late Walsh "Peach" Bayer and Blanche Frey Bayer of Edwardsville. Along with her mother, she is survived by a sister: Suzanne Bayer of Alton; and many cousins and friends. She attended St. Paul High School and graduated in 1967. She studied for ten years in the Convent of the Institute of the Lamb of God in Owensboro, Ky., and spent five years in France doing missionary work. Later, she was a key punch operator for the State of Illinois in Springfield. Her memberships include St. Boniface Catholic Church. Visitation will be at 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m., on Friday, Jan. 2, at St. Boniface Catholic Church in Edwardsville. Funeral services will be at 10:30 a.m., on Friday, Jan. 2, at the church, with Fr. Jeff Goeckner officiating. Interment will be at St. Boniface Cemetery in Edwardsville. Memorials may be made to the Angel Fund at St. Boniface. We will have a private party at Franks Diner on Saturday afternoon. Franks diner was featured on the Food Network's hit series Diners, Dives and Drive-in's. It is located in Kenosha about 10 miles from the Racine Marriott, their normal business hours are 7am-2pm. On Saturday they will be closing the diner to the general public and reopening just for D6 members. Only 55 people will be able to sign up for this event, so it will be on a first come first serve basis. The diner is NOT handicapped accessible, (there's a couple of stairs into the door). A little history about Franks....In 1926, there was some real excitement in downtown Kenosha when six horses pulled Franks Diner to the spot where it stands today. The structure was built by the Jerry O'Mahoney company in New Jersey and shipped to Kenosha on a railroad flat car. Anthony Franks, who first learned of the unique restaurant opportunity through a magazine article, paid \$7,500 plus \$325 in shipping charges to launch his business. He added a dining room in 1935 and a larger kitchen in the mid 1940s. The Franks family operated Franks Diner until 2001. Please visit www.franksdinerkenosha.com for all the info.

We will be having a set menu for our party, which means you cannot order off the menu! The featured item will be their garbage plate, which was shown on Diners, Dives and Drive-Ins. Our group will have their choice between the ham, bacon, sausage or veggie ½ garbage plates specials. The original garbage plate is 5 eggs the ½ garbage plate is 3 eggs served with hash browns, green peppers, onions, jalapeno peppers and choice of meat; the veggie plate has zucchini, mushrooms and tomato instead. All garbage plates are served with American cheese on top and homemade toast.

For those that don't want the garbage plate your choices are a corn dog basket or chicken strip basket. Both of these come with fries. These can also be split for a children's menu option.
