District 6 Director Elections at our Fall 2011 Regional

This year is an election year for the district 6 director. If you are interested in running for this position and have any questions please contact April. At this time April Brazier will not be seeking re-election.

According to the By-Laws these are the requirements for a District Director:

To be eligible a candidate should have been an active voting member for two membership years. They shall have been an active member of the district in which they are running for office for one membership year. A district director's term is 3 years and they shall serve no more than 2 consecutive terms. Other tasks include:

- Shall have primary responsibility for the continuance of activities in the district and the solicitation of membership.
- Shall screen applicants for membership.
- Shall appoint all committee chairpersons in the district.
- Shall oversee local area chapters and their officers in respect to ongoing activities.
- Shall serve as a member of the Board of Directors.
- Shall work for the formation of local chapters.
- All District Directors are limited to activities within the boundaries of their respective districts with respect to membership and dues.
- Shall provide financial reports for the District and Chapters within the District as per the LPA Policy Manual.
- Shall train the district director-elect.

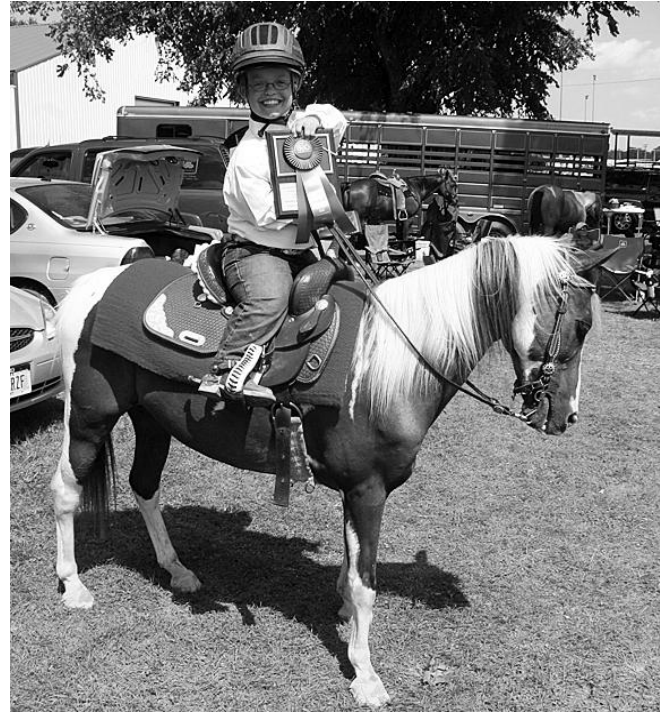

Review of Registration Changes for D6 Regionals

National LPA News

Election Year for LPA Executive Board

This year is elections for LPA's executive board. All positions on the Executive Committee are up for election. Positions include President, Senior Vice President, Vice President of Finance, Vice President of Programs, Vice President of Membership and Vice President of Public Relations. To be eligible to run for a position on the Executive Committee, an individual must meet certain requirements. For President and Senior Vice President, an individual must have been an active eligible voting member for four membership years and have served in an elected or appointed position at the national, district or chapter level for at least two membership years. For the other Vice President positions, an individual must have been an active voting member for three years. If you would like to run for a spot on the Executive Committee, you must announce your candidacy by March 6. To do so, send an email to Ron Piro at RonPiro@aol.com.

LPA National Scholarship Time

If you're a college student it's time to apply for our national scholarships. Awards can range from \$250 to \$1000. Scholarship candidates are evaluated based on involvement in LPA, financial need, academic achievement and involvement and service in their communities. Scholarships are given in order of preference to:

1. members of LPA who have a medically diagnosed form of dwarfism
2. immediate family members who are also paid members of LPA
3. people with dwarfism who are not members of LPA

The deadline to apply for an LPA scholarship is April 22. Winners are announced near or at the time of the National Conference. Please go to the D6 website or the LPA national website to get all the scholarship information and application form. If you need a printed copy mailed to you please contact April Brazier or your chapter president and they will mail you a copy. Applicants must also get a letter of recommendation from either their district director or chapter president, or a national officer please contact them with enough time to write the letter and mail it back to you.

Kitchens Fund for First Time National Conference Attendees

LPA also offers a grant from the Kitchens Fund to its members for first time National Conference attendance. Partial travel expenses or a complimentary hotel room or meal expenses are examples of a typical award.

National Conferences are an important event for the little people community. They provide an opportunity for little

people to see doctors who specialize in treating dwarfs, they provide opportunities for parents of little people to connect with other parents, and they provide a venue for kids and adults with dwarfism to connect with others like themselves. To qualify for a Kitchens Fund scholarship the applicant must meet the following criteria:

1. must be a first-time attendee of a National Conference
2. must be a paid member of LPA in good standing, and
3. any minor child must be accompanied by an adult/guardian

The deadline to [apply for a Kitchens Fund](#) grant is April 30. Applicants are notified by phone or e-mail by June 1. If you need a printed application please contact April and she will mail you one.

Conference Review Committee is now Conference Management Committee (CMC)

In the board meetings at the Nashville LPA conference our Conference Review Committee brought forth a motion to form a new planning committee called Conference Management Committee or CMC to replace CRC and the current way we run our national conferences. Quite frankly the size of our national conferences has doubled in the last 10 years and that's making it impossible for LPA to continue doing our national conferences the way we currently are. Keep in mind, there are a specific number of hotels in the US that can accommodate a group of our size not only in numbers but both meeting space demands and duration. It's time for us to work smarter not harder as our organization grows.

Unfortunately each year as a district takes on the huge task of hosting they are sometimes reinventing the wheel for the conference. After CRC went to a meeting planners conference and did some analysis they found LPA conferences have our key events: medical appointments, workshops, fashion show, etc; its many of the same events each year just in a different location. It was then suggested to move the bulk of the planning for a national conference to a national level so that practices could be standardized, LPA would have more bargaining power with hotels and task of hosting a national wouldn't be so overwhelming to a single district.

Conference will not start being run under CMC until 2013. CMC plans to bring bids for 2013 – 2016 national conferences to Anaheim in July. They are currently assembling multi-year proposals for the board to review. If you wish to know more about CMC or have questions please contact April Brazier or a member of the executive committee.

If you haven't already heard as of 2/7/11 - the Hyatt Regency Orange County which is the conference site is sold out. The fee waiver must be approved by April and only applies to LPA registration costs; you must also be a paid member of LPA to be eligible. Hotel, meal and miscellaneous expenses are the responsibility of the attendee.

Hotel Information: The hotel is located on the Mississippi River in the Moline, IL, part of the Quad Cities. The hotel offers 140 guest rooms equipped with a coffee maker, hair dryer, high-speed internet, refrigerator, and microwave. The hotel has a workout facility, indoor/outdoor heated swim-through pool, laundry facilities, gift shop and business center. For non-achondroplastic dwarfs: results of lateral flexion-extension cervical spine x-ray; with evaluation. (Very important to send x-ray (see below))

The non-achondroplastic dwarf athlete may have a predisposition to neck injuries, including paralysis. Pseudoachondroplasia, spondyloepiphyseal Dysplasia, Diastrophic, Conradi's, Cartilage- hair hypoplasia, and Morquio's syndrome may have instability and not be aware of the problem until an accident occurs. For your safety, we require that all non-achondroplastic athletes obtain x-rays of the neck prior to competition in any running, jumping or diving event, including basketball, swimming, and volleyball. The x-rays should include a lateral-flexion and a lateral-extension view of the cervical spine. Unless there are clinical symptoms to suggest a problem, these x-rays need only be obtained once for the adult athlete. However, in the juvenile and adolescent athlete, we prefer that the x-rays of the neck be taken every **three** years while they are competing since instability may develop with growth.
